**WORK SESSION** - Mayor Edelman called the work session to order at 7:08 p.m.

**Board Action:** No Board action was taken.

Work Session ended at 8:05 p.m.

**REGULAR MEETING** - Mayor Edelman called the regular meeting to order at 8:10 p.m.

**PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE**

**Approval of minutes:** BOT June 13, 2019

**Board Action:** Trustee Goldstein moved the approval of the June 13, 2019 BOT meeting minutes. Trustee Kaufman seconded the motion. All in favor.

**GOOD & WELFARE**

- 1) Mayor Edelman announced that this year's Annual Movie Night at the LY&CC is Wednesday, August 28<sup>th</sup>. Mayor Edelman went on to say that Trustee Diamond has been working very diligently to ensure that this year's Movie Night will be as terrific and successful as previous Movie Nights. He also announced that July 24<sup>th</sup> was Residents' Appreciation Day and Mr. Cory Menking reported that it was a very successful event, with well over 200 players on the course. He added that he would have the full report tomorrow. Mayor Edelman commented that over 200 players was great and inquired if any were interested in possibly becoming

new members. Mr. Menking replied that five (5) were seriously interested. Discussion ensued in this regard.

- 2) Mayor Edelman announced that our “esteemed” Village of Lawrence Administrator, Mr. Ronald Goldman, has earned a spot on the 2019 Municipal Code Honor Roll. It was created in 2001 and offers municipal officials and others the opportunity to acknowledge the efforts of clerks for a job well done. Mr. Goldman, a longtime Lawrence resident who has served as Village Administrator since 2013, was nominated for the honor by fellow Village employees Gerry Castro, Alison Cohen and Lina Fusco. The Mayor went on to say that he appreciates having Mr. Goldman as the Village Administrator and thanked him for doing an outstanding job. Mr. Goldman thanked the colleagues who nominated him.
- 3) Mayor Edelman stated that Deputy Village Administrator Gerry Castro was successful with the County (after approximately 15 phone calls) in the removal of a sign on Broadway (near Congregation Beth Sholom).
- 4) Mayor Edelman announced that the Village had a nice Family Day on May 23<sup>rd</sup> at the LY&CC. He added that he was in attendance, there was a great turnout and it was very successful.
- 5) Park Commission Vice Chairperson, Ms Jacqueline Handel stated that Mr. Dave Sarnelli had submitted estimates for (chain link) fence repairs along the seventeenth (17<sup>th</sup>) hole at the LY&CC golf course, in two different places by the Marina.. Ms. Handel added that ladders for entry into the water had been requested for the Marina (because someone had fallen into the water previously). Village Administrator Ronald Goldman responded that he was awaiting a list of locations (and numbers) from Mr. Dave Sarnelli, to know how to proceed. Mr. Goldman said that he would follow up.
- 6) Trustee Goldstein stated that he read in the newspaper that the Village of Patchogue had passed a Resolution to prohibit the idling of motor vehicles for more than ten (10) minutes. In the spirit of “going green” and to benefit the environment, Trustee Goldstein would like the Village of Lawrence to enact/adopt a similar Resolution or pass a new Local Law: that cars not be allowed to idle within the Village limits for more than ten (10) minutes. Village Administrator Goldman stated that he had a copy of the Village of Patchogue’s Resolution and would provide it to the Village Counsel as a template. Discussion ensued in this regard.

**Board Action:** Trustee Goldstein moved the approval to set a Public Hearing for the next Board meeting (on September 12<sup>th</sup>) to prohibit the idling of all motor vehicle engines for no more than ten (10) minutes. Trustee Kaufman seconded the motion. (Also moved in Item #14)

- 7) Trustee Goldstein stated that "Trustee Kaufman knows a company to go out there and give us an idea of what we need to do to make an official bike lane on Causeway". Trustee Kaufman responded that he could find one if that's what Trustee Goldstein wants. Mayor Edelman requested the information for the next BOT meeting.
- 8) Trustee Kaufman inquired about a Woodmere Club update/status report. Nassau Herald Senior Editor, Jeff Bessen, suggested reading the paper (The Nassau Herald), as they had recently run an article on this subject in this week's paper and had previously been reporting on the subject regularly/weekly. Village Administrator Ronald Goldman gave a verbal update on the status of the Woodmere Club property.

Deputy Mayor Fragin commented that voting is a sacred and serious matter, and should not be denigrated by using “comical/deteriorating” public discourse and names in write-in ballots. He also thanked the voters.

**Item 5 – Approve Village Policies**

**Board Action:** Mayor Edelman moved the approval to renew the existing Village’s Electronic Communication Systems Policy; the Village’s Investment Policy; the Village’s Procurement Policy; the Village’s Vehicle Use Policy; the Village’s Sexual Harassment Policy; and the Village’s Workplace Violence Policy for 2019 - 2020. Deputy Mayor Fragin seconded the motion. All in favor.

Village Attorney Peter Bee’s office had reviewed these policies in the year 2017 ( and the Sexual Harassment Policy in 2018) and found them to be in compliance with New York State Law and had previously explained that New York State Law and State Comptroller Policy require all villages to have specific policies.

**Item 6 – Approve proposed LY&CC Resolution**

**Board Action:** Trustee Goldstein moved the approval of the below proposed LY&CC Resolution:

**INC. VILLAGE OF LAWRENCE**

**BOARD RESOLUTION**

WHEREAS, in the interest of economy and efficiency, the Village has determined to provide certain services at the Village’s Lawrence Yacht & Country Club through a vendor; and

WHEREAS, consistent with this, the Village has determined that it no longer needs to employ staff in the following positions: of 1KJ-Cleaner (part-time) and PDB-Golf Ranger (part-time) and PCL-Golf Starter (part-time) and 4KE-Laborer (part-time) and OKC-Recreation Attendant (part-time), now, therefore, it is

RESOLVED, that for reasons of economy and efficiency, the foregoing positions of employment are hereby abolished in the Village of Lawrence, effective July 25, 2019, or such other date as may be approved by the Nassau County Civil Service Commission.

Trustee Diamond seconded the motion. All in favor.

**Item 7 – Approve retaining of Consultant for Site Subdivision Plan at the former Lawrence Sewer Treatment Plant**

**Board Action:** Mayor Edelman moved the approval to retain Bladykas & Panetta, in the amount of \$10,700.00, as the lowest responsible proposal/quote for “WPC” (Water Pollution Control) Subdivision - Conceptual subdivision /site plan for the former Sewer Treatment Plant. Trustee Diamond seconded the motion. All in favor.

**Item 8 – Approve retaining Consultant for Phase One/Phase Two ESA (Environmental Site Assessment) at the former Sewer Plant property**

**Board Action:** Mayor Edelman moved the approval to retain Partner in the amount of \$2,200.00, as the lowest responsible proposal/quote for Phase One (1) ESA (Environmental Site Assessment) at the former Sewer Treatment Plant property. Trustee Diamond seconded the motion. The vote was as follows:

**Item 12 – Proposed Resolution confirming BZA recommendations regarding parking on Martin Lane and Broadway**

**Board Action:** Deputy Mayor Fragin moved to approve the following Resolution confirming BZA recommendations regarding parking on Martin Lane and Broadway:

**WHEREAS**, the Village’s Board of Zoning Appeals has conditionally granted an application for an area variance related to 15 Martin Lane; and

**WHEREAS**, certain of the conditions were granted subject to the amendment of certain existing Village Code prohibited parking provisions; and

**WHEREAS**, this Board is desirous to make the changes necessary to meet the conditions of the Board of Zoning Appeals; and

**WHEREAS**, this Board has the exclusive jurisdiction to enact and amend vehicle and traffic regulations, including parking regulations, within the Village boundaries;

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Board of Trustees of the Village of Lawrence, as follows:

**Section 1.** Schedule XIV of Chapter 200 of the Village Code, entitled “Parking Prohibited Certain Hours”, is hereby amended by adding the following prohibited parking

- (i) no parking on the entire length of the West Side of Martin Lane from 7:00 a.m. through 10:00 a.m. daily;
- (ii) no parking on the entire length of the West Side of Martin Lane from 5:00 p.m. through 10:00 p.m. daily;
- (iii) no parking for the first 50 feet of the East Side of Martin Lane from Broadway South towards Rolling Hill Lane from 7:00 a.m. through 10:00 a.m. daily;
- (iv) no parking for the first 50 feet of the East Side of Martin Lane from Broadway South towards Rolling Hill Lane from 5:00 p.m. through 10:00 p.m. daily;
- (v) no parking for the first 50 feet of the South Side of Broadway from Martin Lane West towards Lawrence Avenue from 7:00 a.m. through 10:00 a.m. daily; and
- (vi) no parking for the first 50 feet of the South Side of Broadway from Martin Lane West towards Lawrence Avenue from 5:00 p.m. through 10:00 p.m. daily,

as follows (**new language in bold and underlined**):

**§200-53 Schedule XIV: Parking Prohibited Certain Hours.**

In accordance with the provisions of § 200-22, no person shall park a vehicle between the hours listed upon any of the following described streets or parts of streets:

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, this action is determined to be a TYPE II action under the NY State Environmental Quality Review Act (“SEQRA”).

Mayor Edelman seconded the motion. All in favor.

Mayor Edelman informed the Board and public that the Village has received numerous complaints about landscaping/bushes/foilage overhanging on the sidewalks. The Village personnel advised homeowners to please cut their bushes. Some homeowners were very cooperative while others (unfortunately) had to be given summonses. The Mayor went on to say that in addition, the Village has surveyed the sidewalks in the Village; and where the sidewalk is broken or in disrepair the Village has sent letters/notices to the homeowners to please have their sidewalk repaired (including the names and telephone numbers of three contractors recommended by the Village to do so). If the homeowner chooses not to repair/remedy the situation, the Village will repair the sidewalk at the expense of the homeowner.

Mayor Edelman announced that Sunday, July 28<sup>th</sup>, there will be a picnic at the LCFD Firehouse at 1:00 p.m., and everyone (including Board members) is invited.

**Item 13 – Approve setting a Public Hearing to prohibit construction and/or landscaping on the Federal Holidays of New Years Day, Martin Luther King Jr. Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day (July 4<sup>th</sup>), Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day**

**Board Action:** Trustee Goldstein moved to approve setting a Public Hearing to prohibit construction and/or landscaping on the Federal Holidays of New Years Day, Martin Luther King Jr. Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day (July 4<sup>th</sup>), Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day for the next Board of Trustees meeting on Thursday, September 12, 2019. Mayor Edelman seconded the motion. All in favor.

**Item 14 – Approve setting a Public Hearing for a new Local Law of 2019 to prohibit the idling of all motor vehicle engines (within the Village boundaries) for more than 10 minutes**

**Board Action:** Trustee Goldstein moved to approve setting a Public Hearing for a new Local Law of 2019 to prohibit the idling of all motor vehicle engines (within the Village boundaries) for more than a period of 10 minutes, for the next Board of Trustees meeting on Thursday, September 12, 2019. Deputy Mayor Fragin seconded the motion. All in favor.

On motion by Mayor Edelman, seconded by Trustee Kaufman, and unanimously approved, the Board adjourned at 8:53 p.m.
