CHAIRMAN KEILSON: The next matter before us is Jacobowitz, 175 Central Avenue. Will they or their representative step up.

MR. PANTELIS: Just for the record, of course, this is really a continuation of the last month's hearing.

CHAIRMAN KEILSON: Right.

MR. PANTELIS: At which the Board tentatively voted to approve the application subject to a reduction of a certain square footage in the surface coverage, and I assume that you'll bring us up-to-date from that point.

CHAIRMAN KEILSON: Mr. Macleod, if you can synopsize in brief exactly what we had voted on to approve.

MR. MACLEOD: Okay, very good. Good evening, members of the Board. Following on from our meeting last month --

CHAIRMAN KEILSON: She has your address?

MR. MACLEOD: John Macleod, 595 Park Avenue,

Huntington, New York 11743.

At the previous meeting we agreed to reduce the building coverage to 8.5 percent overage, and in order to accomplish this, we trimmed back certain areas of the building structure and

We reduced the front porch by 36 square feet, the garage by 21 square feet, and we took a thin sliver down the middle of the building which resulted in two inches, actually, only two inches, resulted in the remaining square footage that we needed to reduce the overall to bring it down to 8.5 percent.

MR. PANTELIS: Is that 277.1 square feet?

MR. MACLEOD: It is --

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affirming that? I'm not questioning the veracity of what was stated, but just occasionally we get letters.

MR. MACLEOD: We do not have any further letters at this time.

MS. SCHLOSSBERG: Dr. Moskovic decided to come in.

CHAIRMAN KEILSON: You have to identify yourself.

MS. SCHLOSSBERG: Sorry. Sharon Schlossberg,
111 Harrison Street. One neighbor decided to come
in person to let you know whether or not he
approves or disapproves, and the other one did not
come.

CHAIRMAN KEILSON: Well, I'm sorry, can you step forward so we can just ask a few questions.

It's very important. Can you describe which neighbors and what their proximity to the property is.

MS. SCHLOSSBERG: So last time two neighbors came with questions, one was Dr. Moskovic to the right-hand side of the property and one was Dr. Feit to the left-hand side. Dr. Feit said she couldn't come tonight, but that she didn't have any objections. And Dr. Moskovic said he wanted

to come in person.

2 CHAIRMAN KEILSON: Okay, fine.

MR. PANTELIS: And just on the record, what was the solution that --

MR. MACLEOD: So the solution is illustrated on the latest file plan is that we would be installing a retaining wall on the rear property line and the two-thirds — the two side property lines up to the front portion of the house. This retaining wall is at elevation ten to the top of the wall, and the regrading within the property which directs the water towards the catch basins in the rear and the catch basins and trench drains in the front is collected in the Cultec drainage system which is illustrated on the plan. So at this time there will be no water from this property being spilled onto the neighbors' properties.

MR. PANTELIS: What is the proposed construction of the retaining wall in terms of material, finish and any other decorative aspects of it?

MR. MACLEOD: So the retaining wall is currently illustrated with a poured concrete foundation with an offset footing to the inside of

the property so it does not disturb anything beyond the property line. And above ground there will be a yet to be selected finish material of either a concrete face block or brickwork to match some of the other structures that we hope to put forward on this property in the future, but it will be matching materials with the overall project.

MR. PANTELIS: Any fencing?

MR. MACLEOD: There will also be a railing on top of that, as illustrated on the drawing, and the wall detail there will be a decorative iron railing on top of the retaining wall.

MEMBER SEIDEMANN: Are there neighbors on all four sides, front, back, right and left?

MR. MACLEOD: Not on the front, but yes, on the sides and rear.

MEMBER SEIDEMANN: The neighbor in the back was also spoken to?

MR. MACLEOD: I believe the client has spoken to all the neighbors.

MS. SCHLOSSBERG: The other neighbors were okay the first time around.

MEMBER SEIDEMANN: And the neighbor in the back, is his house -- is the front of his house

1	facing your property or facing away from your
2	property?
3	MS. SCHLOSSBERG: Facing Margaret, the next
4	street over.
5	MEMBER SEIDEMANN: So you share a back
6	there's a backyard in between?
7	MS. SCHLOSSBERG: Yes.
8	MEMBER SEIDEMANN: How long will the entire
9	construction process take?
10	CHAIRMAN KEILSON: That's not really all that
11	relevant because they're going to do construction
12	after this.
13	MEMBER SEIDEMANN: I just mean of the wall,
14	the drainage, the drainage and the wall.
15	MR. MACLEOD: I would say if we were
16	identifying this as a separate item, this type of
17	construction would probably take probably take
18	about a month.
19	CHAIRMAN KEILSON: You mean in the context of
20	future construction?
21	MR. MACLEOD: But we would do it all at the
22	same time.
23	MR. PANTELIS: Yes.
24	MEMBER GOTTLIEB: What is the thickness or
25	the width of the wall?

MR. MACLEOD: The wall is eight inches thick above ground.

MEMBER GOTTLIEB: Okay. Just when you mentioned the finishing, when you discussed the finishing, was that the finishing facing the homeowner who is applying or the finishing that faces the four neighbors around it?

MR. MACLEOD: It would be finished on both sides.

CHAIRMAN KEILSON: I think you also mentioned for the record we have a letter from the engineering firm affirming that this will be the solution in terms of preventing any overflow.

MR. MACLEOD: Yes, we have two statements; one is on the drawing from the surveyor that prepared the site plan. In the middle of the drawing right above the seal it says: All proposed contours shown are contiguous with the adjoining parcels, existing contours and will not create any surface water runoff to the adjacent properties.

And then this plan was also examined by Paul Stevens, an engineer for Sidney Bowne & Son Engineers, and the letter that you have in front of you was submitted to us -- to you, actually

directly to you after he had reviewed the plans, and he is also stating that based on the proposed work here that it will not result in any storm water runoff flowing onto any adjacent neighbors' properties.

CHAIRMAN KEILSON: Did you want to add something?

MS. SCHLOSSBERG: Just to backtrack for a second. We would need to do this before we do any construction because we can't approve any construction till we go through the FEMA step.

MEMBER GOTTLIEB: Right.

CHAIRMAN KEILSON: That doesn't really bear on --

MEMBER GOTTLIEB: That addresses the other -that just addresses the other question that we had
regarding the construction time, because this job
needs to be complete before they can work on the
house before they go to FEMA or even work on the
house.

CHAIRMAN KEILSON: Absolutely.

MR. PANTELIS: With respect to the drainage and the engineering comments, Sidney Bowne, for the Board's information is a well-known, reputable firm, and Mr. Stevens is very highly regarded. So

you've got a good analysis.

CHAIRMAN KEILSON: Okay, thank you very much. Are there any questions from the neighbors or the audience at this time? Okay. Any further questions from the Board?

Then at this point we're going to take a vote based on the information provided, based on the engineering report. Mr. Gottlieb.

MEMBER GOTTLIEB: And also based upon that there were no neighbors who issued any complaints and who represented that the adjoining neighbors did have no issue. With that information I will vote for this.

CHAIRMAN KEILSON: Miss Williams.

MEMBER WILLIAMS: For.

CHAIRMAN KEILSON: Mr. Seidemann.

MEMBER SEIDEMANN: Based on what we've heard and seen tonight, I will vote for this.

CHAIRMAN KEILSON: Mr. Henner.

MEMBER HENNER: For.

CHAIRMAN KEILSON: And I as well will vote for. And time? Two years, whatever.

MR. MACLEOD: Two years are requested at this time.

CHAIRMAN KEILSON: No reason not to.
